<u> Proposed Big Bin Event - Save the Date Sep 19 & 20</u>

We are hoping that we might be able to have another Big Bin Event this year, but it is contingent on current COVID-19 social distancing requirements being relaxed.

The City of Edmonton is reviewing and re-working their policy regarding future events at all community halls. Once we have some clarity and direction from the City, we will provide an update.

Edmonton City Police (EPS)

Each day Edmonton Downtown Division reviews call logs to help identify 'hot spots' for increased patrol. EPS base their activities on statistics, so even if the item that was stolen has minimal value, report it.

If you notice any suspicious activity please call the non-emergency EPS number, 780-423-4567, and listen to menu options to report mischief and suspicious activity. We have invited a member of EPS to attend our next meeting (May 19) to discuss crime, security, as well as to help explain the changes made in light of the fact that there is no longer a dedicated Rossdale officer.

Crime Prevention -- As the summer approaches and activity in the neighbourhood increases, both good and some not so good, a reminder of some of the things you can do to help prevent crime in our area:

- Get to know your neighbours.
- Be aware of strangers and look out for each other.
- Leave keys and emergency phone numbers with a trusted neighbour.
- Keep up appearances a well-tended neighbourhood is less attractive to criminals and vandals.
- Avoid putting refundable containers/bottles out with garbage.
- Get involved in crime prevention programs. Check out the EPS website for tips on crime prevention.

Capital City Clean-up

If you choose to pick up litter on public property around where you live, work or play, please be safe and follow the safety guidelines listed below.

Litter kits are available through our community league. Each kit includes a safety guide, litter grabber, a pair of gloves, and small and large garbage bags. If you wish to participate in the City cleanup, please request a litter kit from the RCL Executive.

Preparing For Your Clean-up

- Wear gloves at all times.
- Dress appropriately for the weather.
- Wear sturdy footwear (no open-toed shoes).
- Wear a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent.
- Be familiar with your clean-up area.

During Your Clean-up

- Do not pick up needles/syringes, glass, sharp, heavy or oversized objects or hazardous waste. Call 311 to report the location so that the item may be collected by City staff.
- Do not approach homeless encampments; call 311 to report the location for clean-up.
- Do not compress garbage or reach into containers with hands or feet.
- Do not wade into the water to retrieve items.
- Do not walk on roadways or steep hills and embankments.
- Do only pick up litter during daylight hours.
- Do try to work with a partner or group and carry a cell phone.
- Report Graffiti by calling 311.
- Remember to stay hydrated and wash your hands after your clean-up.
- Do not trespass on private property

Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL)

EFCL has received official announcement from the City's Neighbourhood Services identifying the extent to which the budget cuts have affected their department. EFCL is working with Neighbourhood Resource Coordinators to determine how EFCL can best support Leagues through this change.

Users of baseball and soccer amenities must continue to adhere to two-metre physical-distancing rules, ensure gatherings are kept to 15 people or fewer, and avoid or limit touching commonly touched surfaces like sporting equipment or stationary field objects.

<u>Hall Rental</u>

The community hall will remain closed until the City and the Province lift the COVID-19 restrictions and as a result no bookings are currently being taken.
